15 January 1970

CAP 1-2-7. A USAC member of a CAF 1-2-7 patrol accidentally detonated an H-20 booby trap rigger with trip wire at BS 441055, 6 km SI of by Tin District Feadquarters. Two USAC were TLA(M) by the explaining off. A search of the area for further STDs was nonproductive. RESULDS: 2 USAC TLA(H).

CAP 1-1-3. A GET 1-1-3 patrol discovered 1 °C : MA and 3 Chi Comprehates in some busines at Br 353178, 5.5 km SE of Tam My Gity. Apparently dead for about 10 days, the VC was believed to have been billed in a contact with Cal 1-1-3 on 6 January 1970. REGULES: 1 VC HIA and 3 Chi Comprehates destroyed.

CAI 1-4-2. The fortified resettlement haslet of Charleman, defended by Cal 1-4-2, a USA rifle platoon, and PUDF, received 57am LR, RPG, and m-79 fire, and a heavy volume of AMF and LAF from an UJM at B: 775361, lo km LE of non Min District Teadquarters. Several of the enemy infiltrated into the hemlet and directed SAF into civilian houses. The defenders returned organic weapons fire, used artillary illumination and spook; gunship support, and repelled the accaders who withdrew in an unknown direction. One USA, 1 PF, and 12 W civilians were TLK; 1 USA and 19 civilians were TA(E); and 13 houses were completely destroyed in the action. A sweet of the area disclosed a WC NDA (2 credited to CAF), 1 .45 cal pistol (credited to USA), 1 cartridge belt, and 1 RPG round. The UC round was destroyed. PsyOps was notified. REULMS: 1 USA ETA, 1 CLE IT TAA, 12 WM civilians MIA, 1 USA MIA(1), 19 VM civilians MIA(3), 4 VC KIA (2 credited to CAP), 1 INC (not credited to CAI), 1 cartridge belt captured, 1 ACC round destroyed, and 13 houses destroyed.

CAP (1-3-9) A Cast 1-3-9 patrol initiated organic weapons fire on 1 VC at 35 195002, 11.5 km 37 of Binh Son District Headquarters. The VC returned SAF and fled F7. 1 USMC was VLA(x) in the action. A sweep of the area Gisclose 1 1-16 rifle and 1 block trail. LEGLES: 1 USMC VLA(x) and 1 TC.

CF1-4-6. A GAT 1-4-6 patrol initiated organic weapons fire on 2 VC at BS 730782, 7 km I of on Tinh District Headquarters. One VC was KIA and the other flow I without returning fire. As the patrol continued on, one Ud. C was IA when he accidentally detenated an Olima mortar round boost tray right dit: a trip wire firing device at IS 730770. A nedevac helicopte was colled in and received SAF from an USEF 1000 meters to the I. Helicopter gunships escorting the medevac suppressed the enemy fire. CLP 1-3-12. Upon hearing an explosion and receiving information from a PAF unit that an UALE was burning Lien Tri Hamlet at he oldows, 4.5 hm LE of Bikm for District he equarters, CLP 1-3-12 dispatched a patrol to investigate. As it approached the hamlet, the patrol initiated or; nic weapons fire on the enemy, who fied W without returning fire. A sweep of the area disclosed 4 houser completely destroyed and I bangalore torpedo which the MAP destroyed in place. Most of the villagers had fled the hamlet and there were no casualties. PsyOps was nothfied.
RECULTS: 1 bingalore torpedo destroyed; 4 VN homes destroyed by terrorists.

CAP 1-2-7. A SAP 1-2-7 patrol rectived R.G and hAF from an estimated 5 70 located at BC 450053, 2 km S7 of Ly Tim District Feadquarters. The patrol returned organic weapons fire, causing the enemy to fiee Ly. Three PFs were wounded in the action and medevaced by helicopter to the 91st Evac Cospital. A sweep of the area was nonproductive. RPULAC: 3 NOTA(3).

25 January 1970

CAR 1-4-3. A MP 1-4-3 patrol with a sniper term from the 5th marked beginner of teached initiated 50mm morter fire and sniper fire on an USEF at a range of 700 m at NS 770537, like ME of ton Tinh District headquarters. The enemy field FW without returning fire. A sweep of the area disclosed 1 VO LIA by sniper fire. A SULFE: 1 VO LIA.

26 January 1970

CAP 1-4-5. R. Chi 1-4-5 albush initiated organic wealons fibre on a known 75 moving 6 in a restricted area at RI 595774, 5 km. I of Son Tinh District Leadquarters. A sweep of the area disclosed 1 T3 kHz.

A 3 ? 1-4-5 patrol observed 4 73 with weapons and 35 7N divilians carring food and a large quantity of expended shall arms certificate Lovin; 2 at 55 714799, 7.5 km NE of Son Tink District Leadquarters. The VJ fled I into a tree line and the patrol apprehended the 35 Vk. The VJS were taken to District Residuarters where one Violate, age 10, was inhediately identified as a local VC guarrilla by District authorities. RASIDEC: 34 705 captured and 1 70 90%.

MAP 1-3-5. A Chr 1-3-5 patrol initiated organic veryons fire on 1 VJ at hi 516907, 9.5 ha VE on Rinh Son District Meadquarters. The VC disappeared from sight without returning fire. A sweep of the area disclosed 1 VZ LL, and 1 A-10 rithe. REVIAMS: 1 VZ LE and 1 IV.

30 January 1970

A sweep of the area disclosed 1 VC KIA, 1 AK-47, 2 Chi Com groundes, and 1 cartridge belt. The grenades were destroyed. RESULTS: 1 VC KIA; 1 IVC and 1 cartridge belt captured; 2 Chi Com groundes destroyed.

CAP 1-3-5. A CAP 1-3-5 patrol received SAF from 3 VC at the edge of a rice paddy at BS 695947, 10 km ME of Binh Son District Headquarters. The patrol returned organic weapons fire, killing 1 VC. The other 2 VC fled ME. While sweeping the area, the patrol approhended 3 VI female who had been working in the rice paddy and who were without ID cards. Unresponsive to questioning by CAP PF, the 3 VCS were taken to District Meadquarters for further interrogation. RESULTS: 1 VC KIA and 3 VCS.

CAP 1-3-9. A CAP 1-3-9 patrol received SAF from an USEF located at BS 514673, 10 km SW of Binh Son District Headquarters. The patrol returned organic weapons fire and called for a reaction force from the CAP patrol base. As the reaction force approached the area of contact, it received SAF from an estimated 50 VC at BS 516078. The reaction force called an artillery fire mission on both groups of energy, causing that to flee W and SE, respectively. While sweeping the area of contact, the CAP approhended 13 VN civilians without ID cards. Unresponsive to questioning by CAP PF, the 13 VCS were delivered to District Readquarters for further interrogation. Continuing on, the CAP received SAF from 3 VC at BS 516820. The patrol returned organic weapons fire, causing the energy to flee SE. A sweep of the area disclosed 1 VC KIA. RESULTS:

31 January 1970

CAP 1-2-5. Ambush engaged (20) VC moving W to E. VC returned fire with small arms, machine gun and M-79 fire and split into three elements, fleeing in several directions. Second ambush of CAP 1-2-5 engaged several of the fleeing enemy, as did an ambush from CAP 1-2-2. CAP 1-2-5 swept the area finding: (2) VC KIA and (1) AK-47. Results: (2) VC KIA; (1) AK-47 captured.



## 3. Operations

## a. General

- (1) The 1st Combined Action Group continued to conduct operations that enhanced the accomplishment of its assigned mission of village and hamlet security and the goals of the GVN Accelerated Pacification Program (ACP) throughout the reporting period. In conjunction with the ACP, two CAP's were relocated in Tam Ky District and one CAP was relocated in Ly Tin District.
- (2) Enemy activity continued to decline resulting in fewer contacts, fewer sightings and fewer kills than the previous month. The lack of enemy activity may be due to the lack of sufficient forces in the 1st CAG area of operations to mount any major attacks. If the present level of activity continues the level of pacification in many of the CAP's TAOC's will undoubtedly be upgraded.
- ate contact during the month. The four major operations being conducted continued to produce favorable results, as a total of 400 VC and 199 NVA were reported killed. This was a total increase of 59 kills over last month. Operation Fredrick Hill, being conducted west and south of 1st Company's CAP's, had the best results with 252 of the total kills. Operations Geneva Park and Nantucket Beach, operating around the third and forth Companies respectivly, were moderately successful, combining for a total of 183 of the total. The Iron Hountain Operation being conducted outside the Group's operational area, accounted for the remainder of Mic kills. Plans remain underway to relocate one company of the Combined Unit Pacification Program to a new area. The 198th and 196th Infantry Brigades continued to provide logistical and tectical support, as required, throughout the month.

## b. Activities

- (1) The C.P's continued to conduct combined operations with the Regional Forces and Popular Forces during the month. On several occasions to C.P's combined forces for one day operations in or near their TACC's. During the high threat period of TET the 198th Infantry Brigade positioned rifle platoons near the coastal C.P's and located a reinforced company near CAP 1-3-9 in the village of An Phong. The Americal Division continued to maintain the bulk of its forces to the west of National Highway #1, with occasional small unit operations in the coastal areas to the east. During the periods that US Army units were positioned in or near CAP TAOC's, the CAP's frequently conducted joint operations with the Army units.
- (2) CACO 1-1 experienced fewer contacts and sightings than the previous menth and ended the month with only cloven (11) enemy kills as compared to twenty seven (27) for the month of January. The company captured two (2) POW's but failed to receive any Hoi Chanhs during the month. CAP's 1-1-4 and 1-1-5 were installed in their new TAOC's which brought the company up to its original strength of seven (7) platoons.
- (3) GAOO 1-2 had fewer contacts than the previous month (three (3) as opposed to twelve (12) for January) but the number of enemy kills remained the same, a total of eight. The company had the highest ratio of captured weapons per kill, accounting for six weapons. Ly Tin District continues to be the least active of the four districts, evidencing a high degree of pacification. The PF's are numerous and capable in CACO 1-2's area.

CAP 1-2-3. A CAP 1-2-3 ambush initiated organic weapons fire on an estimated 30 VC moving SE at BTh3h096, 5 km NW of Ly Tin District Headquarters. The enemy returned RPG, mortar, and SAF and fled NW. The ambush called an artillory fire mission on probable enemy routes of escape. Fifteen minutes later, a second CAP 1-2-3 ambush nearby initiated organic weapons fire on an estimated 15 VC moving NW at BTh3h107. The enemy returned mortar fire and SAF and fled NW. Helicopter gunships were used to fire on the action of escape. One PF was wounded in the action and was medevaced by helicopter to the 91st Evac Hospital. A sweep of both contact areas disclosed 8 VC KIA, 6 AK-h7 rifles, 10 ChiCam groundes, and miscellaneous documents. The grenades were destroyed and the documents were taken to District Headquarters for analysis. RESULTS: 1 PF WIA(3), 8 VC KIA, 6 IWC 10 ChiCam grenades destroyed, and miscellaneous documents captured.

CAP 1-3-4. The Thuan Phuoc Hamlet Chief apprehended 5 VC carrying a large quantity of ChiCom grenades at FT652016, 10 km NE of Binh Son District Headquarters. The hamlet chief informed CLP 1-3-4 that the VC had intended to use the grenades in an attack against the CAP He did not relate the circumstances surrounding the apprehension. The 5 VC POW were taken to District Headquarters for questioning. RESULTS: 5 VC POW (not credited to CAP) and a large quantity of ChiCom grenades captured (not credited to CAP).

5 February 1970


CLP 1-4-4. A CLP 1-4-4 patrol called an artillery fire mission on 3 VC observed across a river in a restricted area at a range of 700 meters at BS738884, 12 km NE of Son Tinh District Headquarters. The artillery impacted among the VC, killing all 3. Because of the intervening river, it was not practical for the patrol to conduct a sweep, but the 3 bedies were clearly visible laying in the open, motionless and obviously dead. RESULTS: 3 VC KIA.

7 February 1970

CAP 1-4-6. A CAP 1-4-6 patrol apprehended 1 VN male attempting to flee from the patrol at BS712790, 7.5 km NE of Son Tinh District Headquarters. Carrying a 20 1b bag of rice and 1000 \$VN, the VN admitted to being a VC supplier. He was taken to District Headquarters for further questioning. RESULTS: 1 VC POW (VCI), 20 1b bag of rice and 1000 \$VN captured.

9 February 1970 -

CAP 1-3-9. A CAP 1-3-9 patrol initiated organic weapons fire on 1 VC who was wearing grenades on his belt and who was observed across a river at BS463884. He was SW of Binh Son District Headquarters. The enemy fell to the ground and was clearly visible at a distance of 100 meters, lying in the open, metionless and obviously dead. Because of the entervening river, a sweep of the area was impractical. RESULTS: 1 VC kIA.
